



Domestic Violence in South Dakota

WHAT IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?

Domestic violence is the willful intimidation, physical assault, battery, sexual assault, and/or other abusive behavior as part of a systematic pattern of power and control perpetrated by one intimate partner against another. It includes physical violence, sexual violence, threats, and emotional abuse. The frequency and severity of domestic violence can vary dramatically.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IN SOUTH DAKOTA

- The lifetime prevalence of rape, physical violence or stalking by an intimate partner for South Dakota women is 33.7%.ⁱ
- Nearly 2/3 of South Dakota domestic violence homicides are committed with firearms.ⁱⁱ
- Although American Indians comprise less than 9% of the population of South Dakota, they accounted for over 26% of victims/survivors of reported forcible rapes in 2012.^{iii,iv}

DID YOU KNOW?

- 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men have experienced some form of physical violence by an intimate partner.^v
- On a typical day, domestic violence hotlines receive approximately 21,000 calls, approximately 15 calls every minute.^{vi}
- Intimate partner violence accounts for 15% of all violent crime.^{vii}
- Having a gun in the home increases the risk of homicide by at least 500%.^{viii}
- 72% of all murder-suicides involved an intimate partner; 94% of the victims of these crimes are female.^{ix}
